

The Active Travel to School Team at Active Cumbria, part of Cumberland Council and Westmorland and Furness Council, is committed to improving lives through physical activity and supports active and sustainable travel approaches for children, parents and carers across the county.

Active travel involves travelling to school using physical activity such as walking, scooting or cycling. The county has several effective programmes in place to support schools to encourage modal shift towards regular active travel, with funding from the Department for Transport, Active Travel England and Cumberland Council and Westmorland and Furness Council.





- Active travel can improve the mood of children arriving to school refreshed, alert and ready to learn.
- Active travel can help children gain a better understanding of road safety and promote a feeling of independence.
- A reduction in traffic congestion and air pollution on the school journey and around the school gates.
- Active travel to school is good for the environment and reduces carbon emissions on the school commute.

All primary school children are offered Level 1 & 2 cycle training in Key Stage 2, with additional funding available for Level 3 training for secondary school students. Training is delivered by our highly experienced partner Cyclewise. In addition to valuable cycle skills, **Bikeability enhances the health and wellbeing of children in the following ways:**

### **County Initiatives** & Projects

County initiatives provide opportunities for schools to promote active travel beyond the key national campaigns to support long term behavioural change.

There is also the opportunity to take part in our termly active travel challenge 'Feet First', which consists of a 5-day active travel challenge during a specific week each term.

This initiative hopes to embed regular active travel habits on the school run in an achievable format for schools and parents to engage with.

All participating children receive a free bookmark and small individual prize, with the opportunity for schools to enter for additional regional prizes.

The **Active Travel to School** team promote and amplify several national active travel campaigns and initiatives throughout the academic year.



# Active Travel School Travel Plans

A School Travel Plan is a practical plan used by schools to manage their transport issues and offers a more comprehensive approach to reviewing and tackling school congestion.

They have two main purposes:

To reduce the number of private vehicle trips to a school site by encouraging and/or developing alternative travel options

To raise awareness about travel issues such as air pollution and road safety to the school community



School travel plans are also a requirement for schools who are making planning applications for school building developments.

The **Active Travel to School team** offer support to develop School Travel Plans, providing guidance, templates and liaison with county collegues to support development and implementation of sustainable travel approaches.

Additionally, School Travel plans embed sustainable travel policy into school documentation in support of the Sustainability and Climate Change Strategy for Education (DfE).

Problems with congestion and parking are issues that face many of our schools across the county due to the challenges of the geography. The Active Travel to School team can offer advice, support and resources to assist schools with addressing these issues.

Typical resources include:

- Resources and advice to set up a Park & Stride Scheme or a '5-minute walking bubble'
- · Resources and advice to set up walking bus
- Safe parking pledge postcards and resources
- Liaison with the wider council team, including planning, traffic management, local committee, and community policing

### **Active Travel Street Tag**





Street Tag is a free mobile app that turns the world around the user into a virtual playground. Points are gained by actively travelling to and from places, in addition to scanning virtual tags that have been scattered throughout the community. Tags can be found on the route to school. in local parks, at local events and more or less anywhere and everywhere making it really easy to ioin in the fun!

Active Cumbria have secured an initial partnership with Street Tag and schools can sign up to Street Tag for FREE. We have created a school based physical activity competition for all education establishments in Cumbria. Schools can have up to two teams of 250 members per team and are recruited by downloading the app and scanning the unique QR code assigned to their school.

The whole school community is invited to take part, whether staff, governor, parent, or pupil.
